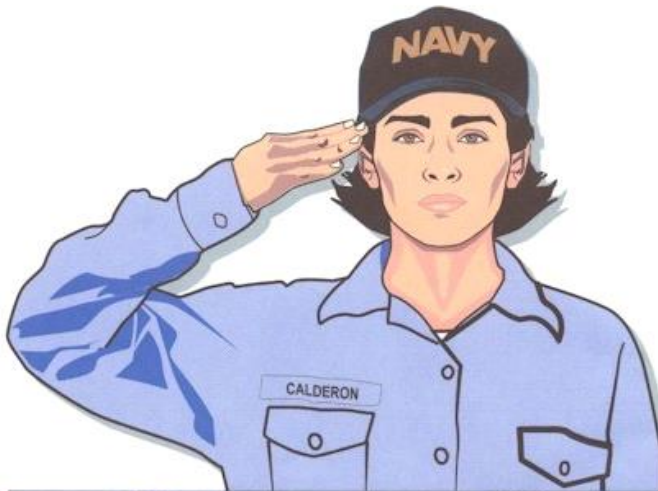


Hand Salute



HOW

- * RAISE RIGHT HAND IN A DIRECT MANNER
- * TIP OF FOREFINGERS TOUCHES THE LOWER PART OF THE HEADGEAR ABOVE AND TO RIGHT OF THE EYE.
- * KEEP THUMB AND FINGERS STRAIGHT AND FIRMLY TOGETHER.
- * SHOULD BE ABLE TO SEE THEIR ENTIRE PALM WHEN LOOKING STRAIGHT AHEAD.
- * THE UPPER ARM IS PARALLEL TO THE DECK AND THE FOREARM IS AT A 45 DEGREE ANGLE.
- * WHEN NOT IN RANKS TURN HEAD AND EYES TOWARD THE PERSON OF COLORS BEING SALUTED.

WHEN

- * EXECUTE AT ATTENTION OR WHILE MARCHING.
- * SALUTE OFFICERS, PARADING COLORS, OR STANDARDS.
- * 6-8 PACES OR AT THE NEAREST POINT.
- * SALUTE COLORS OR THE MUSIC FOR COLORS WHEN IN SIGHT OR HEARING.
- * SALUTE WHEN COVERED AND OUTDOORS
- * INDOORS IF IN THE PERFORMANCE OF WATCH STANDING DUTIES.
- * JUNIORS ALWAYS SALUTE FIRST.
- * SALUTE SMARTLY.



When "**SALUTE**" is given, raise your right hand smartly in the most direct manner until the tip of your forefinger touches the lower part of the headdress above and slightly right of your right eye.

Your fingers should be extended straight and joined with the thumb along the forefinger.

You should be able to see your entire palm when looking straight ahead.

Your upper arm should be parallel to the deck with the elbow in line with the body and your forearm at a 45-degree angle.

Your wrist and hand should be straight, a continuation of the line made by your forearm.

At the same time, if not in ranks, turn your head and eyes toward the person or colors you are saluting.
